I recommend making sure the accommodations are restricted to only 2-3 person rooms for everyone, or are at least about the same for everyone, or even underbooking so that no one has to share a bedroom even if they share a suite (but I understand this would require much more funding). That being said, this was the only issue I had with the program, which overall I enjoyed very much!"
